There were seven handouts consisting of a mixture of tulips, approach and departure directions, gridlines, passing under power lines, road colours of junctions, etc. Most were straightforward, except for the hand out from TC8 to 9 which consisted of passing through a series of

grid squares; I couldn't get the last bit to fit until offered a little help.

The route was an interesting mix of fast straight sections, twisty bits including Hurdletree Bank, a very nasty hairpin at Clark's Hill, and some rough but not damaging dotted yellows.

Robin Hood Stages Rally – Birklands Stage – Sherwood Forest Saturday 10th & Sunday 11th March

If you go down to the woods today!!

Having marshalled the Robin Hood Rally last year, Carole & I knew what a good event it was. This year promised to be even better. For the first time ever there were over 100 historic (HRCR) entries on any event in the UK and 60+ moderns. Additionally this year we would be able to marshal the Saturday evening stage in the dark and watch the historic through for their first run.

We had the invitation to marshal the same stage this year from Ian the Stage Commander shortly after the conclusion of the Premier last year. He certainly is very well organised both on stage and off stage.

Carole, unusually, had the Saturday off work and so we both made our way over to Birklands Stage start for signing on at the prescribed time. We were assigned to an uphill 90deg bend for in-stage marshalling along with DEL1 – a great pair of gents who made the evening more enjoyable.

The appointed hour came and with all in place and functioning correctly and with numerous course cars passed, the historic began to fly through the stage.

Oh, I remember the days (just) – many, many years ago when we used to trek out to Sherwood, Scotland or Wales to watch the Lombard RAC Rally, the proper rally, before it became various other things and ended up as the “Rally of South Wales” or to be correct, The Rally of Wales GB! The sound of those Mk1 & Mk2 Escorts flying through the forests, the smell of Castrol R, getting showered with loose gravel and sandy soil or flying rocks as the works teams and clubman alike battled it out for individual supremacy in their own class. Even a good sound system attached to the TV and turned up as loud as you dare still couldn't match the thrill or the bark of the Escorts through the forests, pursued hotly by other works teams in a variety of cars including the likes of Audis, Saabs and Lancias to name a few.

Quite amazingly there was only one problem in our sector and that was with a Mk1 Lotus Cortina. It ground to a halt on the uphill section just before our bend. DEL1 radioed in the in-stage stoppage and I went to investigate. I had only just made the scene safe deploying their triangle and showing their “OK” board to other competitors, when within a very few minutes they were mobile again, seemingly at rally speed. Regrettably, within a few minutes, they were reported missing in-stage and were found in a short while later about ½ mile further into the stage along a very long, almost straight, section broken down with the same electrical gremlin. This time the problem was to be terminal for them.

All the action was over by around 2130 and although we offered to assist with changeover (the stage being run in the opposite direction on Sunday) we were told that it was all in hand and so we departed for home, around an hour's journey away.

Sunday was to be a reasonably early start as we had to pick up Andrew Gilbert who sometimes marshals with us, he lives a handful of miles away – in the opposite direction. That done we set off for Birklands once more and enjoyed a full day of rally sport. The schedule for the day was once more through for the historic and twice through for the moderns. EEMC representation was boosted further with Peter Mears on start radio / control on Sunday.

As ever Kevin Procter, in his Subaru, was competitive and flew through our corner and away downhill with all the gusto of a two wheel drive on his first attempt of the day! He looked on the ragged edge, but controlled the car very well. I guess when it came to the second time through Birklands for the moderns there were still a few stages to go and so, although still very quick, there was perhaps a slightly more measured approach – maybe? Certainly he didn't leave any souvenirs for us to collect unlike last year.

Enough ramblings from me except to say that if rallying is your burn then this is a terrific event, as is the Premiere – Oh and The Dukeries too, and not ever so far to travel. Wonderfully enjoyable, thanks Lindholme Motor Club and thanks to Ian for the invite and again for the invite to the Dukeries. We'll maybe see you in Sherwood later this year?
